## ***Avian Influenza & Outbreak Update*** ***Most recent news . . .***

Avian Influenza (H7N9 HPAI) was detected in Lincoln County, Tennessee in birds in a commercial poultry farm.

The facility is under quarantine, along with approximately 30 other poultry farms within a 10 kilometer radius (6.2 miles) of the site. The affected flock was depopulated to stop potential spread of the illness, and officials are testing and monitoring other flocks within the quarantined area. ## ***AU Bio-Security Recommendations***

Basic bio-security measures should always be used. It is more important than ever to make sure you are cleaning your loft regularly, washing hands going in and out of the loft, monitoring or perhaps restricting others from going in and out of your loft and placing new birds in a quarantine section before integrating them with your other birds.
